#### God As We Understood Him

My dad passed away on Sunday, February 15, 2015. Now two days later I am compelled to share with my dear friends a miracle, one of many, that happened for me and my sister as we tried to help in his final days. His last day in the hospital it was apparent that the end was near. We made the decision to ask for Hospice care. The staff that was to assist us in that process repeatedly gave us bad information that led to a high level of frustration for us. The staff left us in the family lounge while they put together their plan.

As we sat in our sadness and frustration, a man of color came out of the restroom and stood in front of me. He may possibly have been homeless given his torn clothing, stuffed pockets and filled grocery bag he was carrying. He asked me if I sing. I told him that would be the last thing anyone would ever want me to do. He asked the same of my sister and received the same response. Then he asked if I sing when I am alone. That I did have to admit. He then said, "You know when we sing alone there are people all around us listening that we never see." That touched my heart. I thanked him for that reminder that I needed in that moment. Next he said, "I'm going to sing you the Lord's Prayer like you have never heard before."

What came next astounded me and will be in my heart forever. He began to sing in the most glorious voice. He did sing the prayer and when he finished he continued to sing prayers that were on his heart and mine. When he finished I stood in front of him and asked his name. "Thomas." I hugged him close and whispered to him that he is an angel. Thomas held me close and began to pray over me, not in song but the most personal and intimate prayers of my life. When he ended I looked at him and said I wished there was something I could do for him. The answer truly was my *conscious contact with God, as I understood Him.* Thomas looked at me and said, "Just let it out, God knows your heart." In my peace and tears Thomas was gone.

This event needs no interpretation from me. Further I know that each of you, as my recovery family, will recognize immediately, that without all you have taught me, my heart would never have been opened to allow such a miracle to occur.

My deepest love to each of you. Your prayers, love and support are treasured by my family.

It is the time of year when we begin the recertification process. You will receive a recertification packet in the mail sometime between the end of March and beginning of April. If your address has changed, please notify me to receive your documents in a timely manner.

There will be two forms that must be completed. One is the service checklist. All AMIAS must complete 6 hours of service between March 1, 2014 and February 28, 2015. Those planning to help during the AA international convention in July will need to complete service hours for this year in order to be recertified before July. There are many ways to accumulate service hours. Simply attending an Alateen meeting does not count if you are not the sponsor for that meeting. If you need ideas or clarification for service, please ask me or Jenny. Those certified after January 1, 2015 will not have to have all six hours for this year's process. The service form will be returned to me.

The second form is for the annual background check. This form will be sent to BOSMA. You will be provided mailing labels for both forms. Please send them in as soon as possible. There are many steps to the recertification process and they all begin with you. All paperwork must be completed before May 15.

If you are serving as the Current Mailing Address for an Alateen group, you will receive a separate mailing from the World Service Office. It contains a form with the group's information as it appears in the WSO records. There is also an envelope addressed to me. Please acknowledge and /or correct the information and send in the form. I appreciate all of you who donate your time to Alateen..

## Group Records Coordinator's Report

In November, WSO updated their database and our GR-1 form (Al-Anon Registration / Group Records Change Form) to include a Group Email field. A group can now create a group email address that can remain the same over the years as Current Mailing Addresses (CMAs) change. WSO is encouraging groups to do this to help provide consistency in receiving important electronic information. If a group does not have a group email address, electronic mail will then be sent to the CMA email address listed. Group Representatives (GRs) do not receive electronic mail from WSO--this is only sent to the group email address first, or then to the CMA email address.

Please ask your group's CMA or GR to check your group's listing in the most recent Area Directory that was issued in late December, to see if it has a valid email address listed. Any changes or additions to group information listed in the WSO database and our Area Directory can be made by completing a GR-1 change form located under Meeting Info on our Georgia Al -Anon website, and then sending this form on to your District Representative. DRs, please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

## Literature Coordinator's Report

In November, I had the opportunity to visit District 1, where I was asked to share the writing workshop "Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships." Thank you so much to all who participated – we submitted 6 sharings on the topic for the Literature project currently in progress. News from WSO:

• **Translations:** The Spanish version of Al-Anon's most recent book *Many Voices, One Journey,* (SB-31) is now available. The French version (FB-31) is also available.

• The Electronic Literature: Al-Anon e-books are now available through the Canadian vendor, Kobo. As always, this is not an endorsement of any outside vendor and WSO is working to expand to other electronic book vendors. I also printed the updated e-CAL Fact Sheet and distributed it to DRs for sharing. It has the details on all books available, where to find them, and how much they cost.

• New Daily Reader: You can now submit sharings on-line. (demonstrate here if possible). So far, 38 submissions have been received. Please keep them coming!

"Literature sales at September 30 totaled \$2,900,900, compared to \$3,154,453 at September 30, 2013—a decrease of 8%. Gross profit on literature sales was \$2,271,774 (78% of sales), compared to \$2,523,854 (80% of sales) last year." Keep in mind that literature sales is the primary revenue for the WSO.

We urge every group to check their listing. Be sure that your Group Contact is aware that they are listed by WSO as their group's Contact and that their phone number and first name will now be displayed when their group map is displayed. This was a decision by the Work Group to leave them in place until AWSC or Assembly decides we should do it differently. We felt it was a benefit to those who are new to our program looking for a meeting to attend.

If they don't want their first name and phone number listed then all you have to do is file a GR1 form through your DR and we will promptly remove it.

Also, we will soon have a vacancy on the Work Group. One of our at-large members will be resigning from the Work Group next month to assume a different service position. If you know of someone who you feel would be a good Work Group member, please pass their contact info to me.

We were also able to spend some long-planned time on discussion and sharing of ideas on how to develop participation in service in our groups. We accumulated a great list of ideas, which are:

- 1. Use method of "standing for office" to elect officers so people will know they are eligible.
- 2. Post a calendar and markers to volunteer chairing, topics, etc. (Visual Reminder)
- 3. Make a group event out of traveling to Al-Anon functions (service & fellowship)
- 4. Ask them if they want to be a GR?
- 5. Talk about how service made me grow in the program.
- 6. Lead by example (attend assembly, share what happened at assembly, share growth from assembly)
- 7. Fun activities as a group
- 8. Experience the energy/hope/fruit Get them to attend something besides the weekly meeting get them hooked on what has already been proven.
- 9. Personal invite not just announce at a meeting. Volunteer to drive. Add a Meal.
- 10. Sell on the idea of togetherness and fellowship promote not Alone.
- 11. Inviting the fellow members to attend Assembly as visitors but not voters.
- 12. Sharing in discussion groups info from service in the forums.
- 13. Only way to keep it is to give it away!
- 14. Point to a person and tell them they would also be so good at this job.
- 15. Invite someone in the group to go to Assembly.
- 16. Prayer.
- 17. Invite them for coffee or breakfast after a meeting, so they get to know us.
- 18. Talk about the gifts of service very specifically. I.e., rehearsal of new behaviors or boundary practice with "safe" people, other Al-Anons.
- 19. Culture General mindset that service is a good thing positive reinforcement for people stepping up.
- 20. Steps/Traditions/Concepts of Service if Service is a meeting topic, then it is discussed and not too scary.
- 21. Sharing how much fun it is
- 22. Sharing Spiritual power of large group of Al-Anons working together.
