Delegate's Report (Cont.)

Georgia Al-Anon helped host more than 57,000 members of A.A. and Al-Anon at the 2015 A.A. International Convention. We greeted guests with Southern hospitality and helped them find their way around before and during the convention. This required recruiting and training approximately 500 Al-Anon volunteers.

In conjunction with the A.A. International Convention, our Public Outreach Committee implemented a billboard project placing ads in and around Atlanta. The PO project continues and is looking to expand into three other areas around the state. One district launched a 3-month outreach project placing ads in movie theaters.

Our website was redesigned to include maps to meetings and a password-protected members' area with access to information such as the Group Records Update/Change form, Alateen forms, AMIAS Handbook, and where to send donations for our different service arms. Georgia Alateen groups grew by 4 this year for a total of 22 groups, 3 of which are held in schools.

The 2016-2018 Area 11 Al-Anon/Alateen Assembly Information and Archives Booklet was compiled and distributed to all Assembly members. This booklet provides information about officers' and coordinators' job descriptions, motions and recommendations from January 1983 through September of 2015, and the *Policy and Procedure Manual* for Assembly.

Our biggest challenge is finding members willing and able to serve throughout the links of service.

I look forward to serving beside you this term and all the things our Higher Power has in store for each of us as individuals and as an Area.

Literature Coordinator's Report

Greetings to all from your new Area Literature Coordinator. Well, we've got the January Assembly under our belts for Panel 56. I wouldn't mind bouncing around to "Happy" again. Our Literature Room managed to do most of the right things and we sold approximately \$1800 of books and pamphlets. We did run out of a few items and I hope to correct that for our May Assembly. Group orders for pick-up/payment at Assembly are encouraged as it speeds the checkout process and also lessens the likelihood that we will run out of certain books/pamphlets in the Literature Room. Please get your orders in to the Georgia Area Central Services (GACS) office by Monday or Tuesday of the week of Assembly (preferably earlier) so the order can be timely processed.

Electronic Literature continues to expand. Currently available e-literature includes *Alateen: Hope for Children of Alcoholics* (eB3), *Courage to Change* (eB16), *Having Had a Spiritual Awakening*, (eB-25), *How Al-Anon Works* (eB-22), and the *Forum* Magazine. You can find information on these publications on the WSO website (www.al-anon.org), but to order, you will need to contact your electronic media provider. When searching for Al-Anon e-literature, if you query under "Al-Anon Family Groups" you can find all Al-Anon publications available from that provider.

You can still order *Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism 2016* from WSO, but remember that it is also available in its entirety on the WSO website. Another group resource is the growing number of podcasts on the WSO website. There are now podcasts addressing all 12 steps, sponsorship, common concerns, and introductions to meetings. The 2015 Membership Survey is also available on the WSO website. Also available are research/survey documents addressing topics such as Readiness for Step Twelve, AFG Newcomers and Members, Who Stays and Who Drops Out, and Concerns About Drinkers in Their Lives.

WSO continues to seek sharings from members for possible inclusion in three upcoming publications, our as yet unnamed new daily reader, "Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships", and "Parents and Grandparents of Young Problem Drinkers". Writing Guidelines and submission information are available on the WSO website.

The 2015 World Conference Summary contains a wealth of information, but often is not in stock in our Literature Distributions Centers. One suggestion: reach out to your outgoing Panel 53 District Representatives to see if they are willing to part with the copy they have.

If anyone is conducting a workshop based on or focusing on a particular piece of Conference Approved Literature, please email me a heads-up prior to assembly so that I can have sufficient copies available for sale in the Literature Room.

Please feel free to contact me with questions about Al-Anon literature and also observations about what I can do to make the Literature Room at assembly a better experience. You can email any of the Coordinators from the Area 11 website Contact Section (www.ga-al-anon.org).
