Dear Georgia Al-anon,

This year's World Service Conference Theme was "Realizing Our Spiritual Potential." Serving these first 6 months as your Delegate I have been thinking about this theme and what it means in my life. When I first came to Al-Anon I had been beaten down by the family disease of alcoholism. I was hurt, angry, withdrawn, and extremely shy. I didn't want to be here, yet I had nowhere else to go. My family was falling apart and I was scared and felt all alone. The only potential I could see was one of failure. Al-Anon gave me hope. It opened my eyes to new attitudes and new friends. I slowly began to heal. I went from being withdrawn to learning how to reach out for help by calling other members. They shared their experience, strength, and hope with me. I went from being alone and frightened to having friends and gaining new insights. I went from a place of despair to having a vision of hope. Then it was suggested that I start giving back to the program. In giving back I began to have a sense of self worth.

Today I continue to grow through being of service to others. I believe my Higher Power provides me with service positions because they present me with opportunities to learn how to be less than perfect in front of a group of people who love and accept me. Through the guidance, encouragement, and support of others, I am able to grow and learn new skills by applying our Steps, Traditions, and Concepts in difficult situations. I have learned that it is important for me not to isolate while in service. I must still reach out to my HP and those Trusted Servants who came before me and ask for help.

I was so excited when June's copy of *The Forum* came out to see we had two contributions from Georgia members, and one of them is an Alateen! *The Forum* is such a valuable resource not only for me as an individual, but also for groups I attend, in helping to provide meeting topics and having older copies available to give to newcomers.

We now have a 'Let's Forum' tri-panel display at Assembly with lots of great information on sending in shares, getting subscriptions, and encouraging others to purchase subscriptions. If you aren't able to attend assembly and are interested in any information about *The Forum*, please email me at altdelegate@ga-al-anon.org. One great suggestion on the display that came from an Area Highlights newsletter, was to pass a can around for loose change in your home group. When \$11 is collected, have a name drawing from group members, and that person wins a subscription to *The Forum*. Everyone please encourage your groups to purchase a subscription if they have not already, since complimentary copies are no longer being sent out to groups by WSO. Georgia has had a decline in paid subscriptions recently, down from 528 in June of 2015 to 496 in March of 2016. That is a decrease in 32 subscriptions and this amount includes electronic subscriptions and any groups that purchased their own subscriptions in March. Let's see if we can get that number up by 10% before November. That is 50 new Forum subscriptions. If one group out of every six orders a subscription--we can do it! Also, as a fun way to encourage additional subscriptions to *The Forum*, anyone bringing in a personal subscription copy of a recent Forum to the registration table at Assemblies, will get a gold star to wear on your permanent name badge. Let's all try to become 'Forum Stars' by the end of this panel!

As I started to get in touch through prayer and meditation, I began to have a love and yearning for the God of my understanding. Today, I am so dependent on his guidance.


Asking for his will, not mine, has helped me devote my time to things in my life that I truly enjoy, with a freedom I had never known before.

I have to admit, joy isn't a feeling I I experience often. It sneaks up on me when I do feel it and it surprises me. After



This spring I found myself feeling like my program was stale. I wasn't enjoying meetings like I used to. I felt like I just wasn't making progress in areas of my life that continue to give me trouble. I wondered if Al-anon was still the place for me. So, I not only started making Gratitude Lists, but I began going back and writing responses to questions related to Steps I -3 in my daily journaling. This reflective practice prompted me to recall all the times my Higher Power has shown up for me when I "Let go and let God." I noticed a couple of patterns. First, I noticed that I still have a tendency to want "big" moments and that I think I won't experience joy unless a moment is "big." Second I realized that serenity came when I quietly went about doing the small things my Al-anon friends taught me to do, like go to meetings, call someone when I get upset, journal about my feelings, and practice staying in the present moment. Letting go of expectations about how things turn out while practicing unconditional acceptance has brought me unexpected joy. I am grateful for a Higher Power that helps me remember how to get my life back on track. I am grateful for the Al-anon program which gave me the tools to open up my heart and my mind.

Without an AMIAS, Alateens cannot have a meeting. Make announcements in your Al-Anon groups to encourage Alateen attendance. If there is not an Alateen meeting close by...consider starting one. If there is one close by...cheer them on by letting Al-Anon members know there is a program for their teenagers. Family recovery plays an important role in unity, understanding, support, sense of belonging, and unconditional love. Hello Area II,

As your Area Alateen Coordinator, I attended and survived my first GA Alateen Conference! Area II recently hosted our 17th Alateen Conference held at Rock Eagle in Eatonton, GA. We had a record number of teens and what's even more amazing is the number of teens that preregistered! I'd like to personally thank all of you, your groups, and districts that so gratefully contributed to help make this conference a success. Special thanks to Thomas E for chairing, his committee, the attending AMIAS and especially the teens! Together We Can Make It!

On June 9th, I participated in my 2nd Area Alateen Coordinator's conference call with the WSO. Topics discussed were the results of the recent Alateen survey, the Power Point Alateen training modules and the Alateen service e-manual. I was provided a lot of useful data and am now processing all the information received (with the help of my H.P!).

Cynthia S (AAPP) and I have been reviewing our existing AMIAS handbook looking for conciseness, consistency, correctness, and completeness (the 4 Cs!). We hope to have this task completed within the next two weeks. One item being looked at is the training of prospective AMIAS. Currently, Assemblies are the only times AMIAS training is regularly offered (3x per year). Under consideration is the option to offer it more frequently (i.e. monthly) via phone conferencing and screen share technology for the Power Point presentation. This would eliminate prospective AMIAS from having to travel to Macon for training. Unless these prospective AMIAS are already planning to attend Assembly, trying to schedule time for travel and attendance can be quite challenging. Those attending Assemblies routinely (i.e. GRs, DR, Coordinators and Officers) would have that same option available to them. This way they would not have to choose between attending an offered workshop and AMIAS training.

Literature Coordinator's Report

Here's hoping you're having a Happy, Joyous, and Free Summer.

We had a great time in the Literature Room at the January Assembly and we sold a bunch of Al-Anon literature to boot. Thanks for your purchases - keep coming back.

I'd like to highlight a few great literature items for your consideration. P-24, Groups at Work, is the first 78 pages of our Service Manual. It tells you about the Al-Anon structure, how to run a meeting, and how to form and keep healthy groups. It's a great bargain for a dollar. Some groups choose to give every group member a copy. M-80, Alateen Table Card, is a way your group can support and promote Alateen. It says, "Has Al-Anon helped you? Wouldn't you want to give that gift to a child?" What a powerful message. You could display in your group, in an AA group, or in your clubhouse or meeting space. M-75, Al-Anon Legacy Posters, are 4 full size display posters containing the Steps, Traditions, Concepts, and Warranties. P-5, Blueprint for Progress, is the original booklet for working your 4th Step inventory. It's a great companion to the newer, larger Blueprint for Progress Workbook. S-24, Focus/Declaration Table Card, is a new table card. It's a reminder to keep the focus on us by not bringing in outside references to our professions, religion, and other 12 step programs. Some groups ask someone to read it before every meeting.

The currently featured publication on the WSO website is the book "In All Our Affairs - Making Crises Work For You". Chapter I, From Denial to Awareness, is presented in its entirety.

Coming in August will be the print copy of the 2016 World Service Conference Summary. It will also be available on the WSO members' website. Currently on the members' website are highlights of the 2016 World Conference Summary, including information on memorial gifts, changes of Concept 11, Task Force Presentations, discussion of the Prayer for Today, and information on the 2018 Al-Anon International Convention in Baltimore.

WSO continues to seek your sharings for a number of future publications, including our New Daily Reader (working title), Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships (working title), and Parents and Grandparents of Young Problem Drinkers (working title). You are also invited to send your sharings for the Forum, Alateen Talk, and Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism. Guidelines and suggestions are available on the WSO members' website.

If you are presenting a workshop at Assembly, and anticipate that it will generate interest in a particular piece of Conference-Approved Literature (CAL), please send me an email so that I can take that into consideration as I put together the literature order for Assembly.
