Congratulations Georgia Al-Anon for increasing paid Forum subscriptions 11.4% over this time last year! In June's newsletter, I challenged groups to purchase their own subscriptions after WSO discontinued sending complimentary copies to each group. The challenge was to try to see if we could increase subscriptions by 10%--well, you did it! That's 57 new paid subscriptions. Since we had 276 registered groups at the end of September--that still means many groups aren't receiving this valuable recovery tool. Everyone please encourage your group to purchase a subscription if they haven't already. If funds are tight for your group, consider placing loose change in a can that gets passed around each meeting until \$11 is collected. It is amazing how fast change can add up. My home group has decided to purchase a gift subscription to send to the local public library so a monthly copy of *The Forum* will be displayed with other periodicals. Gift subscriptions to local therapists, doctors, treatment centers, libraries, jails, etc., could be a great outreach project for individual groups.

On a personal note as I look back over my first year in Panel 56, the word that seems to summarize it is gratitude. This year has had its learning challenges as any new position does. These challenges have really encouraged me to reach out and ask for help from others and from my Higher Power. As a result, I have learned a lot more about trust. Group Records Coordinator Report

Hello, Area 11 Al-Anon Family Groups.

News from WSO: In July 2016 WSO implemented a new procedure for Al-Anon Groups "Reported Not Meeting". What does this mean for your groups? It means that if one newcomer shows up at your meeting and cannot find it and hey report it to WSO, your group status will be changed to "Reported Not Meeting". When this happens your group will be removed from WSO's toll-free information meeting line and from the Public Outreach Website meeting search results. WSO will start the procedure below.

WSO Group Records Department follow-up timeline after a group is reported not meeting:

DAY 1: Group Records staff contacts the reported group the same day. The group verifies the status of the meeting. The status of the group is updated.

DAY 3: If the group does not respond after three business days, the Group Records staff sends a notice to the Area Group Records Coordinator.

The Coordinator verifies the status of the meeting.

The status of the group is updated on the WSO Online Group Records application.

AFTER 30 DAYS: If the Area Group Records Coordinator does not respond after 30-days, the Group Records staff notifies the DR or the Area Delegate (if there's no DR for a specific district).

The DR verifies the status of the meeting.

The status of the group is updated through the Area process or the WSO.

Group Records Coordinator continued

WSO suggests all groups consider: 1.)Add signs inside buildings so the meeting can easily be found. Le 2.)Have a note on the door if the group is not meeting on a specific day. 3.)Notify the Area or the WSO right away when the meeting location changes or the group no longer meets.

Please continue to fill out the electronic GR1 form and send it to your DR's. The next version of the Area 11 Directory will be published in January 2017. Please have all your changes in prior to 31 December 2016.

Literature Coordinator's Report

Summer seemed to never end this year, but finally the leaves are falling and there's a nip in the air. This being the case, it must be time for the Fall AWSC meeting, followed by some holiday stuff, leading up to our January 2017 Area 11 (Georgia) Assembly in Macon.

When you come to Assembly, I'd love for you to come meet me in the Literature Room, hang out, hear some music, groove on the light show, meet a new Al-Anon friend, and browse some interesting Al-Anon historical publications and memorabilia. Then you can buy some Al-Anon literature, lots of it. We'll try to have a full range of pamphlets and books available.

At our September 2016 Assembly we sold over \$3000 of Al-Anon literature. Thank you. In January, we'd love to sell that much or more. Come armed with cash and/or checks as we haven't yet worked out that credit/debit card/instant payment thing.

The Central Services Office in Macon, housing our bookstore, would prefer that pre-orders of literature be submitted to them at least a week to 10 days prior to Assembly. These orders will then be available for payment and pick-up in the Literature Room. Pre-ordering increases the likelihood of having your complete order filled and also streamlines the process for everyone, cuts down on waiting in line for checkout, and makes it more likely that the Literature Room won't run out of stock due to day of Assembly large orders.

If you are presenting a workshop at Assembly and anticipate that it will generate interest in a particular piece(s) of literature, please send me an email so that I can take that into consideration as I put together the Literature Room order for Assembly. I'll pass that information along to Central Services so that if their inventory is low, they can order sufficient quantities from WSO in time for Assembly.

The currently featured publication on the WSO website is the book "Discovering Choices". Chapter 1 is presented in its entirely.

The 2016 World Conference Summary is now available in its entirety on the WSO Members website. There is a wealth of information to be found in the Summary. Hard copies should be ordered from your Literature Distribution Center (MAIS or Central Services). You might have to wait a bit as neither of the offices tend to stock copies.

WSO continues to seek your sharings for a number of future publications, including our New Daily Reader (Working Title), Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships (Working Title), and Parents and Grandparents of Young Problem Drinkers (Working Title). You are also invited to send your sharings for the Forum, Alateen Talk, and the next Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism. Most sharings can be submitted electronically. Guidelines and suggestions are available on the WSO Members website.

Speaking of Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism, the newest version for 2017 is available directly from WSO. It's a wonderful publication for an outreach project for your group or district. Pricing is as follows:

25 copies	-	\$ 18	(72 cents each)

100 copies	-	\$ 40	(40 cents each)
200 copies	-	\$ 75	(37.5 cents each)

The second printing can be ordered until February 8, 2017 and will be shipped before April 1, 2017. Some districts consolidate group orders or underwrite group orders so as to get the best price for volume purchases.

If you are interested in some meeting topics, there are some on the WSO Members website. Once you are on the Member's Homepage, type "Meeting Topics" in the Search Box. You will find meeting topic (or book study) suggestions including suggested formats for using the books "How Al-Anon Works", "Survival to Recovery", "Al-Anon's Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, "Dilemma of the Alcoholic Marriage", "Opening Our Hearts, Transforming Our Losses", "Paths to Recovery", and "In All Our Affairs".

If your group or district wants a resource on the use of Conference Approved Literature (CAL), there is a power-point presentation for use at a workshop on CAL. The presentation can help give a better understanding of the development of Al-Anon literature and why we use literature that was developed specifically for Al-Anon. Sometimes questions/situations arise concerning the use of or reference to AA's Big Book in working the Al-Anon program. While Al-Anon owes a great debt to AA, and in fact used AA's Big Book in the early days; it did so because there was no other literature available. While there is a wealth of knowledge in AA's Big Book and Al-Anon members can use any material they find helpful in their personal recovery journey, use of AA's Big Book as a text, or more than a passing reference to AA's Big Book is discouraged in Al-Anon meetings. If you, your group, or your district has an interest in this presentation, please email me at <u>philand123@comcast.net</u>, and I'll be glad to share an emailed copy of the workshop slides. Other resources for a discussion on this topic can be found on Page 104 of the Digest of Al-Anon and Alateen Policies in the current Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (P-24/27), on Page 228 of the book "Many Voices, One Journey" (B-31), and in the pamphlet "Why Conference Approved Literature" (P-35).

If any of you could spare a little time at Assembly, I would appreciate some help in the Literature Room during the 15-30 minute breaks on Saturday afternoon. You'd just help me speed up the line by helping customers get orders ready for checkout and bagging purchases. It's easy-peasy; heck it might even be fun. There's no reason not to have fun while you're doing service. Also, anyone interested in the Literature Coordinator's position for the next Panel might even get a crash course and sales pitch on why this is a great way to do some service for Al-Anon. Information regarding Assembly dates and room rates for 2017 has been updated on the website. To have your Al-Anon event posted on the website, please send me a **pdf** copy of the flier. Also, please remember to attach the flier. I will send you a link to the event once the flier is posted.

At the last Assembly we addressed consequences of removing first names and personal phones numbers from the meetings information on the website. I was asked to reach out to other Al-Anon Area webmasters through *AFG Connects* to see how they handle personal contacts on their website. I have reached out to them and I have received 3 responses. These responses will go to the technology work group to be reviewed.

WSO has given permission to Area websites to link to their meetings database. The technology work group is discussing whether the database would replace or supplement the current map search feature on the website. Once a consensus is reached, the information will be added to the website. Remember:

1) If you need help while looking for a meeting on the website, there are instructional videos provided. Also, there may be a problem if you just use the default value of "An automatically chosen radius." It is best to include a realistic mileage distance from the place marked on the map to the meeting in question.

2) When you go to the Area website, you are entering as a sort of "Public" user seeking information about Al-Anon and you will only see certain general information about Al-Anon.

As a member, there is more information for you on the website if you go to the **Members** tab and log in with the clues provided. After that, if you click on the **Events** tab, you will see events that are relevant to Al-Anon "Members" such as AWSC and Assembly information.

PUBLIC OUTREACH COORDINATORS – DISTRICT 18

We are so grateful the District has allowed "co-Coordinators" for Public Outreach. Working together has allowed us to best capitalize on our combined, as well as, our individual strengths. Covering 11 counties is a large undertaking and we initially focused our efforts on general awareness by ensuring meetings were listed in all online and paper "help" directories identified in 6 of our counties. We contacted (by email) religious organizations in each town with a meeting to provide specific, local meeting information.

Within the most populated county (Forsyth) we have been active on the Forsyth County Drug Awareness Council and have focused on building community contacts. As a result, LouAnn A. recently participated as a panel member at the Drug Council's bi-annual "Drug Summit." The theme of the summit was "Ending the Stigma of Addiction" and LouAnn educated regarding effects of alcoholism on the family and about resources such as Al-Anon and Alateen. Approximately 500 people attended the summit. The summit is held twice a year and at each event, we distribute literature and meeting lists and encourage members to come, wear hot pink "Ask Me About Al-Anon and Alateen" badges and assist in talking with the community and other exhibitors. We have had as many as 17 "Outreachers" at these summits!

We met with the Forsyth County Drug and DUI Court Coordinators and presented Al-Anon and Alateen to approximately 70 participants in various phases of their group counseling sessions.

We have partnered with a local women & children domestic violence shelter to bring an informational meeting once a month. We have 7 members at this time who are willing to come and share their program. The shelter has agreed to provide transportation to regularly scheduled meetings for clients who feel it may benefit them. We are undertaking growing our Cumming Alateen meeting by reaching out to every school counselor and school psychologist in the approximately 20 mile radius of the meeting. We are anticipating a December presentation in person to this group, coordinated by the county's Director of Student Support.

We encourage our District members to be our eyes and ears in their communities to bring Outreach opportunities to our attention. By involving many others in Outreach through the Drug Summit and informational meetings we are attempting to have all members have the mindset that THEY ARE all PO Coordinators and feel more confident and comfortable in their abilities to share the program. Greetings from Southwest Georgia! Our District is experiencing a time of growth and unity. We have many members who attend multiple groups in the District and relationships deepen. Our biggest recent celebration has been the 90th birthday of our resident Al-Anon "black belt." Miss Mattie Lou recently celebrated her 90th "belly button" birthday among family and friends and she is still active in her home group. Groups are preparing to work together to make AL-Anon seen in 2017 by having a booth at local festivals. Hopefully our first booth will be in January. We have also activated one previously inactive group.

District Twenty-One

Covenant AFG (District 21) wanted to share something that they are doing in an effort to be self supporting.

"After we received the information at Assembly regarding the budget shortages for 2015, along with a request for each group to become self supporting by contributing at least \$262 per group we held a group conscience to try to come up with a way to accomplish this. We are a relatively small group - between 8 - 15 members and at the time were contributing 5% to WSO along with what we collected for the Quarterly Appeal. In 2015 our total contribution was \$54.09.

In August of 2016 we decided to have a separate WSO collection each week along with our normal "pass the hat" donation. In the hat is a pink envelope for the WSO contribution. We still send the 5% as our group contribution, and then the pink envelope proceeds and Quarterly Appeals letter proceeds separately.

In just 3 months we have collected \$156 compared to \$54.09 for the previous 12 months! At this rate we should be well over the \$262.00 goal.

We feel great about this since we know how important WSO is to our recovery. Just thought some other groups might want to consider this."

District 21 will be hosting a workshop and speaker meeting Monday January 30, 2017 from 6 - 9 PM with an Al-Anon and an Alateen speaker along with a Kick Off Your Recovery workshop. 
